1. OUTLINE OF 5 YRS B.A., LL.B. COURSE

- B.A., LL.B. (Bachelor of Arts Bachelor of Laws) is a five-year integrated Law course that candidates are eligible to pursue after completing Class 12 or +2. This Law course is an amalgamation of Humanities and Law streams, which allows candidates to study subjects such as History, Sociology, Administrative Law, Criminology, Family Law and so on.
- KSLU runs semester system in which the five-year duration course is divided into 10 semesters.
- KSLU has introduced the Major-Minor system for 5 Year B.A., LL.B. Programme. For a Bachelor Degree, a major is a primary focus of study and a minor is a secondary focus of study. For example, you could major in Economics and minor in Sociology. Majors are typically chosen to compliment a student's career goal, and a minor may be chosen to enhance the major.





5. PRACTICAL SUBJECTS

- There will be no University Examination in all 4 Clinical Courses. The students will be assessed for Maximum 100 Marks in each clinical course based on different modes of assessment like Simulation exercises, practical record submission, Viva etc. prescribed by the University.
- The modes of assessment will be provided by the course teacher.
- Students should take practical subjects very seriously and should follow all instructions given by the Course Teacher in this regard.

6. SCHEME OF EVALUATION (MOST IMPORTANT PART)

In each course carrying 100 marks, 20 marks shall be awarded by way of internal assessment. The end of the semester examination shall be conducted for 80 marks.




6. SCHEME OF EVALUATION

- A student should secure a minimum of 40 Marks in each paper by securing not less than 32 Marks in the end semester examination conducted by the University.
- If student fails to do internal assessment (Not recommended in any case) he should secure not less than 40 Marks in the end semester examination conducted by the University. Otherwise he will be declared as Fail even though he has obtained 39 Marks in the University Examination.
- There shall be no provision for improvement/reattempt. Student have to fulfill the requirement in the same semester in the same batch.
- The Internal Assessment should be completed/submitted in that particular semester only. If any student fails to do so will not be allowed to submit in the subsequent semesters.

MODELATIES FOR AWARDING INTERNAL ASSESSMENT (IA) MARKS

- The 20 Marks for IA shall be apportioned as under.



INTERNAL TEST (10 MARKS)

- -The College will conduct the internal test in the 10th week of the semester.
- -The student should write one essay answer for 7 Marks and one short note/problem for 3 Marks.
- The duration of test will be 1 hour.
- -There shall be two essay type questions of which student shall answer any one and two short note questions/problems of which student shall answer any one.

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ASSIGNMENT (5 MARKS)

- Writing of internal assignment is compulsory. The assignment must be research oriented.
- Maximum marks for internal assignment is *Five (5)*.
- The Course Teacher will allot the Assignment Topics in the 2nd week of the semester.
- It is mandatory to complete the assignment in your own hand writing. In case there is a discrepancy in the handwriting, such assignment will be graded zero.
- The handwriting must be neat and legible.
- Use A4 size ruled or unruled paper sheets having borders for writing the assignment. And only one side of the each sheet shall be used for writing.
- The contents of the assignment must not be less than 15 pages.
- The cover page of the assignment shall indicate the Name of the Student, Class, Roll Number, Subject and Topic.
- Every page of the assignment barring the cover page must have a page number.
- The assignment must contain a Declaration in prescribed format signed by the Student.
- Writing of Index, References/Bibliography is compulsory. Footnote/Endnote method is optional.
- The assignment must be formatted in accordance with the Sample provided by the course teacher.
- Written assignment must be *STAPLED* and put *CELLO TAPE* on the left side of the assignment. Avoid spiral binding, stick file, binding etc.
- Copying of assignments from other students, discussion and group work is strictly not allowed. Such shared/copied assignments submitted by both students/group, will be graded zero.
- Assignments must be submitted within the deadline fixed by the Course Teacher.

SEMINAR BASED ON ASSIGNMENT (5 MARKS)

- Each student shall give a seminar (presentation) on his assignment topic allotted by the course teacher.
- The seminar will be assessed for 5 marks.
- Dates for seminars will be fixed by the course teacher.

SEMESTER END EXAMINATION

- For remaining 80 marks, there shall be end semester examination conducted by the University. The question paper pattern shall be as below:
- 1. There shall be questions from each unit.
- 2. For each unit there shall be 16 marks that shall be apportioned as under:
- a. 10 marks for essay answer Part (a) of the question.
- b. 6 marks for short answer or problem question Part (b)
- Each Unit shall have two essay questions and two short answer / problem questions of which the student shall answer one each.

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7. CRITERIA FOR PROMOTION TO NEXT HIGHER CLASS

- Every student shall be promoted to next higher classes irrespective of the fact that he has failed in any of the papers prescribed for the Study.
- There is no YEAR BACK SCHEME.

8. COURSE DURATION

- Students are required to successfully complete the entire course within Seven years (Five years of normal duration plus two years of extended duration) from admission to the course.
- The candidates who does not complete their degree within Seven years shall be given an extended period of one more year in exceptional circumstances mentioned herein after. When the candidate is unable to appear for the examinations during the extended period of two years.
- i) Due to health reasons to be certified by a qualified medical practitioner.
- ii) Due to supervening disability to be certified by a qualified medical practitioner.
- iii) Due to representing the Country/ State/ University in any sports or cocurricular competitions. Provided the candidate has reported the inability to appear for the examination to the Registrar through the Principal of the respective college within one month of the date of examination which he/she is unable to attend or the term he /she is unable to keep. Provided further that the candidate who has represented the Country/State/University in any sports or co-curricular competitions as done so with the prior permission of the University obtained by applying through the Principal of the College.

9. INTERNSHIP AND COURT OBSERVATION

- Court observation and Internship is part of Clinical Course-IV: Moot Court Exercise and Internship.
- Each student should participate in 3 Moot Courts conducted by the College. (1 Civil, 1 Criminal and 1 Miscellaneous Case).
- 20 weeks Internship is compulsory for 5 Yrs Course.
- Internship will formally commence from 3rd Year of 5 Yrs.
- Internship should be undertaken during vocations or after class hours.
- Internships may be under Judges, law firms, NGOs, Dist. Legal Services Authority, etc.
- For more details regarding Internship contact Mrs. Jayalakshmi V, Asst. Professor, when you people come 2nd year or 3rd year.
- Each student has to observe Court Proceedings in Civil, Criminal and Miscellaneous matters for 10 days each. Total 30 days Court observation.
- Day to day proceedings to be recorded in diary maintained by the student during their internship and Court observation.

10. UNIT TESTS AND MIDTERM EXAMS

- In addition to the Internal assessment the Course teachers will conduct Unit Tests at the end of the each unit.
- In the middle of the semester the College will conduct Midterm Examinations.
- -All the students are required to attend all these without fail.
