#### Cyber Crime:


- Computer Crime, or Cyber Crime, is any crime involves that a computer and a network. The computer may have been used in the commission of a crime, or it may be targeted.
- Cyber crime has emerged as new class of crimes, rapidly increasing due to extensive use of the internet and IT services.
- Maximum Cyber crime cases, about 46%, were related to cyber pornography, followed by hacking.
   In over 60% of these cases, offenders between 18 in 30 years of age.




# Documents Required to File in the Police Station [Cyber Cell]


- · Self Attested, Any one of the Government ID Proof.

- Detailed application describing the whole incident i.e. how the fraudsters obtained the private information.
- Name of any suspected webpage or application used by victim.
- Personally identifiable information of the fraudster like Email id, Phone No, etc.

# What to do if a Police Official Refuses to Your Complaint?

 If you believe that after reasonable time, police is not investigated your complaint, you can send complaint to Superior Officer U/S 154(3) of CrPC, or Magistrate U/S 156(3) of CrPC, to Magistrate.








## Cybersecurity and Social Media:

- Social media has become an integral part of our lives. We use it to keep in touch with our friends and family, share photos and videos of all those things happening in our lives.
- It has replaced phone calls, messages, emails, etc. for a lot of us. But, as with anything else online, all of us need to be aware of the risks.
- The prevalence of social media platforms and the anonymity of its users have paved a way for hackers and other people who want to get unauthorized access to our private accounts, commit cyber-crimes.
- The internet provides us access to everything but it is important to remember that it also provides
   everyone-access to us.
- Therefore, it is necessary to protect oneself from the malicious activities that happen on the web.



#### Case Studies:

Pune Citibank Emphasis Call Centre Fraud:

Some ex-employees of BPO arm of Emphasis Ltd Msource defrauded US Customers of Citibank to the tune of Rs 1.5 crores. It was one of those <u>cyber crime cases</u> that raised concerns of many kinds including the role of "Data Protection". The crime was obviously committed using "Unauthorized Access" to the "Electronic Account Space" of the customers. It is therefore firmly within the domain of "Cyber Crimes".

ITA-2000 is versatile enough to accommodate the aspects of crime not covered by ITA-2000 but covered by other statutes since any IPC offence committed with the use of "Electronic Documents" can be considered as a crime with the use of a "Written Documents". "Cheating", "Conspiracy", "Breach of Trust", etc. are therefore applicable in the above case in addition to the section in ITA -2000.

Under ITA-2000 the offence is recognized both under Section 66 and Section 43. Accordingly, the persons involved are liable for imprisonment and fine as well as a liability to pay damages to the victims to the maximum extent of Rs vorore per water for which the "Adjudication Process" can be

invoked.

#### The Bank NSP Case:

One of the leading cybercrime cases is the Bank NSP case is the one where a management trainee of the bank was engaged to be married. The couple exchanged many emails using the company computers. After some time the two broke up and the girl created fraudulent email ids such a s "Indian bar associations" and sent emails to the boy's foreign clients. She used the bank's computer to do this. The boy's company lost a large number of clients and took the bank to court. The bank was held liable for the emails sent using the bank's system.

#### · Andhra Pradesh Tax Case:

Dubious tactics of a prominent businessman, from Andhra Pradesh, were exposed after officials of the department got hold of computers, used by the accused in one of the many cyber fraud cases in India. The owner of a plastics firm was arrested and Rs 22 crore cash, was recovered from his house by sleuths of the Vigilance Department. They sought an explanation from him regarding the unaccounted cash within 10 days.

The accused submitted 6,000 vouchers, to prove the legitimacy of trade and thought his offence would go undetected but after careful soruting. The contents of his computers, it was

revealed that all of them were made after the raids were conducted. It was later revealed that the

- Avoid the usage of Public Wi-Fi to avoid the Cyber Crimes. It may easily lead to crime because not secured one and can take any details from the mobile especially the Banking Apps in the mobile, User ID and Passwords of any other apps.
