#### Introduction to Sociology II

This Course is an introductory course in Sociology. 

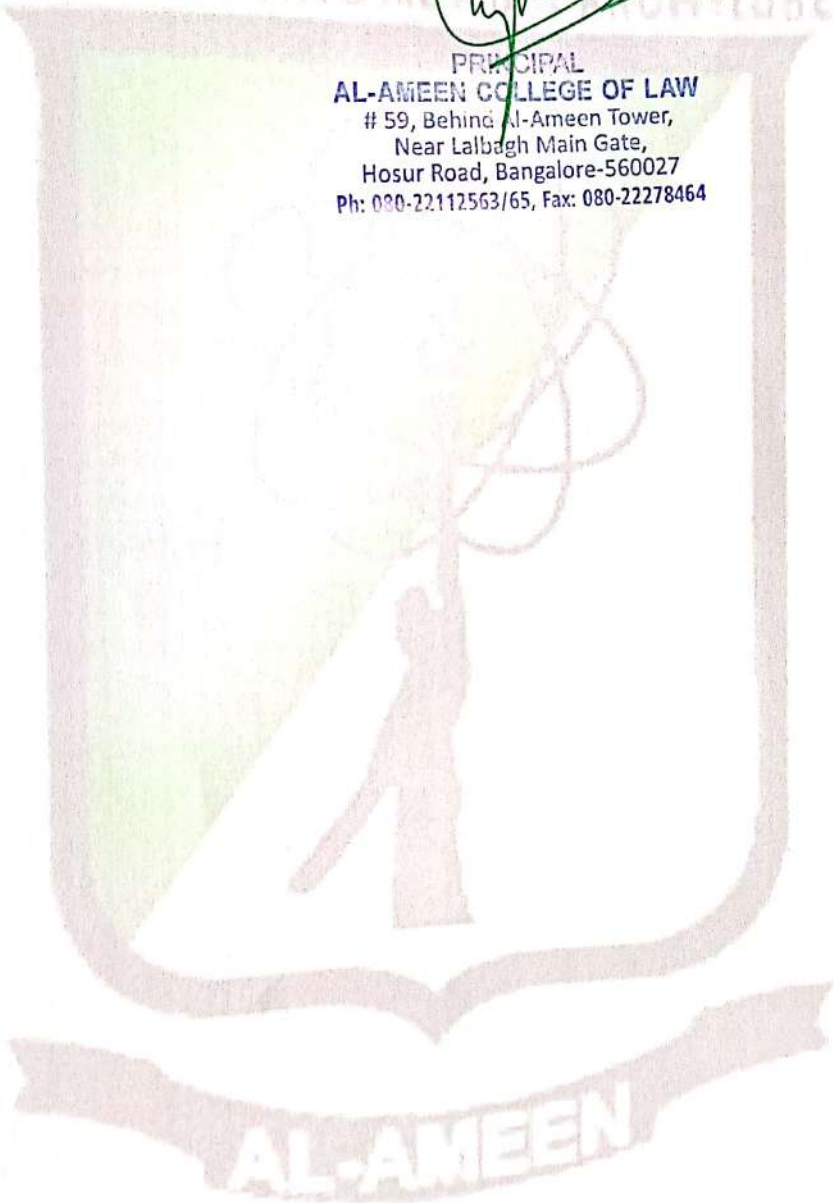
